LATE SUMMER AND FALL ACTIVITIES

The Chittenden Historical Society, Inc., saw late summer and fall filled with activities.

President Bob Muzzy led a group to see Chaffee Falls in August. After the summer rains, it was spectacular. Two members toured the Calvin Coolidge Birthplace in July. A desired visit to the Vermont Folklife Center in Middlebury, hard to sandwich in between other fall activities, will be on the schedule for next year. Attendees to the Vermont Old Cemeteries Annual Meeting in October were treated to tours of the Rock of Ages Granite Quarry as well as Hope Cemetery in Barre.

After being inspired by the space upstairs at Town Hall during the restoration of the Civil War Stage Curtain, Society members spent an October clean-up morning in the little room upstairs at town hall to prepare it for use as a resource room. More work will continue when the weather warms.

In August, a movie night program - with popcorn and lemonade - gave us a view of logging activities in Vermont and the Adirondacks during the 1930s and 1940s. Lively discussion followed.

In October the fall potluck supper celebrated a Vermont Humanities Council sponsored speaker, author Vincent Feeney, whose program, "The Allen Brothers: Original Vermont Developers," was well received.

Also in the fall, the Society announced the publication of a new book about Chittenden, *Chittenden Vermont, A Town History.* Copies are available from the Society for sale at \$30 each; please add an additional \$3 for mailing if necessary.

Reggi Dubin and Fran Wheeler outdid themselves for the Election Day Bake Sale, which is a major fundraiser for the Society. The large voter turnout led to increased sales, and a new record of \$1099 was achieved. Thank you, Chittenden!

Again this year, the annual meeting scheduled for December was cancelled because snowy roads kept members away. The next meeting will be on March 12, 2009, at 7:30 pm in Town Hall. At that time, the annual meeting business as well as program planning for 2009 will be conducted. Maybe we should set a new date for our Annual Meetings?

We are sad to report the loss of one of our longtime members and directors, Allan Arthur, who passed away in early January. Our condolences go to his wife Arlene and his family.

Cemeteries

The new computer enables us to scan pictures for digital use and to archive the old originals, some of which are over 100 years old, for conservation and safe-keeping.

The Grange Hall

Recent renovations to the North Chittenden Grange Hall are not so easy to see for passers-by, but much important work has been taking place. Three major objectives have been accomplished



this year: Electrical power has been buried and upgraded to handle the all electrical demands for the foreseeable future. A new cement floor enhances the lower level. A handicap accessibility lift is now installed to ease travel between the two levels for those with disabilities.

The project is being helped by grants from the State of Vermont and Cultural Facilities Coalition, The Windham Foundation, the Vermont Community Foundation, and a Preservation Trust Grant.
