We get many requests for information from out of state places. If you have information to share, please let us know.

You may have noticed the new look of the Grange Hall. What a difference the new paint makes as Dave Smith gives it his professional touch!


Those who got a closer glimpse of the Grange Hall on Memorial Day could see that there is still a long way to go, but that it will be beautiful when restoration is finished.

The Grange Hall Committee would like to thank Chittenden residents for their generous support at Town Meeting in granting an extension of tax money towards this project.

This fall will see installation of an accessibility lift and some electrical supply. We received a matching grant from the Vermont Cultural Coalition for this purpose. The committee has applied for several more grants (but has yet to hear the results) and will also be seeking other funds to enable us to complete the project ahead of schedule.

The Grange Hall project has also been


assisted by a Preservation Grant, made possible by a partnership between the Freeman Foundation and the Preservation Trust of Vermont.
